## Essential elements of a quality K-12 public school education in Alberta include:

- A public school as the primary and preferred place to provide education
- Equal access for all students, everywhere, to the same educational opportunities – no matter where they live, their background or ability
- Ensuring the safety, health and wellbeing of each student – on the way to and from school, while at school and while involved in extracurricular activities
- Assessing each child to ensure their education meets their learning needs
- Reasonable travel time to and from school
- Certificated teachers as leaders
- Optimal teacher to student ratio
- Well-rounded, experiential and creative learning experiences
- An emphasis on pride of first culture, while providing an understanding of and commitment to the common culture of Alberta and Canada
- Appropriate space, furniture, technology and learning or teaching aids as well as teachers, other staff and volunteers
- Accountability of locally-elected school boards to the communities that elected them for the attainment of all educational outcomes
- An open, welcoming and accepting learning environment that celebrates diversity.
